

## Hardingstone Academy PE Sports Premium Money Report 19-20

### Money Received £17,990.00

From 01<sup>st</sup> September 2013, each primary school received around £8,000 a year to increase PE expertise and standards in this subject area. This additional resource is part of a three-year funding project aimed to improve the quality of the provision for P.E. and sports in Primary schools. In 2017-2018 this amount doubled for schools. This year the academy received £17790.00. The planned expenditure for the academic year 2019-2020 has been aimed at:

- Maintaining the Gold Sports Mark award
- Developing active learning in timetabled lesson times
- Continuing to provide the subsidised extra-curricular clubs
- Developing the range of sports available in school
- Developing and increasing the opportunities SEND children get to participate and represent the school

Developing the coverage of dance in the curriculum.

As a result of the implemented spending in school we have achieved for the year 2019 – 2020 (up to 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2020):

- The Gold Award for the third consecutive year
- The school hosted or attended 6 level 1 competitions
- The school attended 11 level 2 competitions
- 10 clubs ran throughout the school week
- 66.2% attended at least one club
- 60% of KS 2 chn represented the school
- SEND chn took part in targeted intra events in school and had the opportunity to attend 1 L2 competitions
- SSCO package allowed 100% of Year Five pupils to receive sports leader training
- The school now has the resources to develop good teaching and learning of gymnastics.

In reflection of the expenditure in 2019 - 2020, the 2020 – 2021 plan will focus on:

- Continue to developing activity during timetabled lessons to ensure that children have at least 60 active minutes during the school day

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- Continuing to provide the subsidised extra-curricular clubs.
- Developing the coverage of dance in the curriculum.
- To look at more opportunities for outdoor physical activity.
- To continue to expand SEND provision activities within the school.
