

Hardingstone Academy PE Sports Premium Money Report 20-21

Money Received £17,990.00

From 01st September 2013, each primary school received around £8,000 a year to increase PE expertise and standards in this subject area. This additional resource is part of a three-year funding project aimed to improve the quality of the provision for P.E. and sports in Primary schools. In 2017-2018 this amount doubled for schools. This year the academy received **£17790.00**. The planned expenditure for the academic year 2020-2021 has been aimed at:

- Maintaining the Gold Sports Mark award
- Developing active learning in timetabled lesson times
- Continuing to provide the subsidised extra-curricular clubs
- Developing the range of sports available in school
- Developing and increasing the opportunities SEND children get to participate and represent the school

Developing the coverage of dance in the curriculum.
